

10 Steps of SCCS Model

Step 1: Discuss Possibility of SCCS

Objectives:

- Convey perspective that more help is available and may be needed
- Emphasize survivor choice and control

Step 2: Privacy Discussion

Objectives:

- Confidentiality
 - Conversations and issues are not discussed using your name
 - Reporting laws : Re: Abuse and plan to do harm

Step 3: Interview for Referral

Objectives:

- Engaging conversation
- Empowering
- Willingness to secure additional assistance
- Choice to share information
- Decision to use specialized services

Step 4: Release of Information

Objectives:

- What is its purpose
- Survivor retains control

Step 5: Team Meeting

Objectives:

- Role of Team Members
 - Decisions
 - Assignments

Step 6: SCCS Visit

Objectives:

- Engage and Empower
- Individual contact log facilitates discussion of current concerns
- Ratings of concerns
- Re-rate following 3 visits

Step 7: Worksheet

Objectives:

- Prioritizing concerns
- Identifying “visit” goal
- Goal rating
- Action Strategy
- Decide if another SCCS visit is desired

Step 8: RLC Visit and Worksheet

Objectives:

- Identify Tangible need
- Strategy
- RLC areas/classifications

Step 9: Indirect Services

Objectives:

- Accounting for time in service of survivor
- Form definitions

Step 10: Stop SCCS

Objectives:

- Engagement/Separation
- Empowerment
- Recovery
